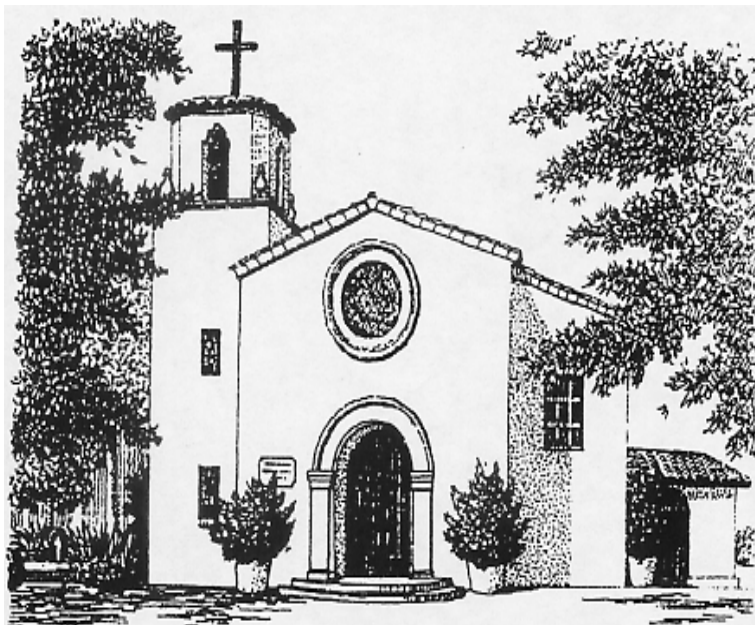

Holy Cross Church began in 1884 as a mission. Visiting priests from the parish in Lockeford held services for Catholics in the Linden area. In 1915, a church was built on the present parish property. The congregation out grew the old church, and that wood frame building was moved to the rear of the property to make way for a new church. The present stucco church was built in 1953, and was dedicated on April 4, 1954. It was constructed by Stockton builders, Ben Merlo and Dan Nomellini. The beautiful cathedral style stained glass windows were created by Carl Huneke, Century Stained Glass Studio, San Francisco. The windows were installed in 1954 shortly after the completion of the church. Members of the congregation donated those windows. In 1963, Holy Cross was made a Parish of the Diocese of Stockton by Bishop Hugh A. Donohoe. The rectory, designed by architect Edward C. Merlo was added in 1975. The activities center and classrooms were completed in 1996.

THE STORY OF MOTHER'S DAY

The earliest Mother's day celebrations can be traced back to the spring celebrations of ancient Greece in honor of Rhea, the Mother of the Gods. During the 1600's, England celebrated a day called "Mothering Sunday". Celebrated on the 4th Sunday of Lent "Mothering Sunday" honored the mothers of England.

During this time many of England's poor worked as servants for the wealthy and lived in their homes. On "Mothering Sunday" the servants had the day off and were encouraged to return to their homes to spend the day with their mothers.

As Christianity spread throughout Europe the celebration changed to honor *The Mother Church* - the spiritual power that gave them life and protected them from harm. Over time *The Mother Church Festivals* blended with *The Mothering Sunday Celebration*. People began honoring their own mothers as well as the church.

In the United States Mother Day was first suggested in 1872 by Julia Ward Howe (writer of the Battle Hymn of the Republic) as a day dedicated to peace.

In 1907 Ana Jarvis, of Philadelphia, began a campaign (beginning with her local church) to establish a national Mother's Day on the anniversary day of her mother's death (the 2nd Sunday of May).

Mrs. Jarvis and her supporters quest of writing to ministers, businessmen, and politicians was successful when in 1911 Mother's Day was celebrated in almost every state. In 1914 President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed Mother's Day a national holiday held on the 2nd Sunday of May.

HISTORIA DEL DIA DE LAS MADRES

La primera celebración del día de las Madres se puede recordar en las celebraciones de primavera de los antiguos Griegos en honor de Rhea, la Madre de los Dioses. Durante 1600 en Inglaterra se celebró un día llamado "El Domingo de las Madres." Se celebraba el cuarto domingo de Cuaresma en honor a las madres de Inglaterra.

Durante este tiempo muchos de los pobres trabajaban como sirvientes para los millonarios y vivían en sus casas. El "Día de las Madres" los sirvientes tenían el día libre y las motivaban a regresar a sus hogares a pasar el día con sus madres.

Tan pronto como el Cristianismo llegó a toda Europa la celebración cambió para honrar la Iglesia Madre – el poder espiritual que les daba vida y los protegía del peligro. Al pasar del tiempo los Festivales de la Iglesia Madre se unieron con la Celebración del Domingo de las Madres. La gente comenzó a honrar a sus propias madres así como a la Iglesia.

En los Estados Unidos el Día de las Madres fue sugerido por primera vez en 1872 por Julia Ward Howe (escritora del Himno de la Batalla de la República) como un día dedicado a la paz.

En 1907 Ana Jarvis, de Filadelfia, empezó una campaña (empezando con su Iglesia local) para establecer el Día Nacional de las Madres en el segundo aniversario de la muerte de su madre (el segundo Domingo de Mayo).

La Sra. Jarvis y sus seguidores tuvieron éxito en su búsqueda al escribir a los ministros, hombres de negocios y políticos cuando en 1911 el Día de las Madres fue celebrado en casi todo el estado. En 1914 el Presidente Woodrow Wilson proclamó el Día de las Madres un día festivo nacional celebrado el segundo Domingo de Mayo.
